Hodges everything I possess on earth Consisting of the plantation and land on which my son in law Redding Hodges now resides, and the following named Negroes to wit: Berdee and her five Children to wit: Ransom, Fanny, Caroline, Jack and Roney together with their future increase also two Horses, nine head of Stock Cattle and thirty head of Stock Hogs with their future increase to be kept by her the said Grapney P. Hodges for and during her natural life, and to be used for the benefit of the said Grapney P. and the lawful heirs of her body during her natural life and at her the said Grapney P. Hodges death the whole of the above described property together with its increase to be equally divided amongst the lawful heirs of the body of her the said Grapney P. Hodges for ever in fee simple
