Alexander E. Garrison

The Will of Alexander E. Garrison made and declared by him on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of July 1870 in our presence under the following circumstances

that said Alexander being at his home in Washington County Georgia on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of July 1870 being near unto death in his last sickness from which he suffered but a short time while the undersigned were present and after calling them to witness the manner and to whom he should dispose of his property. He declared the following to be his last Will:

I give and bequeath to my Nephew W<sup>m</sup> Hugh Garrison my entire estate both real and personal, to have and to hold and use in any manner he may see proper so to do.

I appoint my Nephew W<sup>m</sup> Hugh Garrison sole Executor of this my Will

In about six or seven hours afterwards or after he made this Will he died.

during my sickness I give and bequeath all other goods Books money  
also the tract of land which I find p'm my Father's estate boundaries not  
known to me but being now in Comintrol of my Father in the County of  
Washington in the State of Georgia and all interest that I have or may have  
in the Estate of my Father Thomas Sparks decease late of said Washington  
County the State of Georgia to the support and education of my youngest  
Brother and Sister Adelberty S Sparks and Isabella Jane Sparks and  
Should said property be more than sufficient for the support and education  
of said Brother Adelberty S Sparks and said Sister Isabella Jane Sparks  
until they are educated then all my said property I give and  
bequeath to them except the Cow Watch bequeathed to Noah W Ford  
said Brother and Sister living in Washington County Georgia

3<sup>d</sup> I desire that John S Sparks and Thomas W Sparks shall be  
Executors of this my last Will and Testament John S Sparks living in  
Putman in Brooks County Georgia and Thomas W Sparks  
living in Washington County Georgia This 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1871
