Alexander E Lawson

The Will of Alexander E Lawson made and declared by him on the 29th day of July 1870 in our presence under the following circumstances

That said Alexander being at his own House in Washington County Georgia on the 29th day of July 1870 being near unto death in his last sickness from which he suffered but a short time while the undersigned were present and after calling them to witness the manner and to whom he should dispose of his property. He declared the following to be his last Will,

I give and bequeath to my Nephew W^m Hugh Lawson my entire Estate both real and personal to have and to hold and use in any manner he may see proper to do.

I appoint my Nephew W^m Hugh Lawson sole Executor of this my Will.

In about six or seven hours afterwards or after he made this Will he died.

1st I give and bequeath my large Cotton Patch to Noah W. Flood of Jackson County Missouri

2^d After the payment of all my debts that may have been made during my sickness I give and bequeath all other good Books money also the tract of land which I own from my Father's estate hereafter not known to me that being near the residence of my Father in the County of Washington in the State of Georgia and all interest that I have or may have in the Estate of my Father Shiner Sparks deceased late of said Washington County the State of Georgia to the support and education of my youngest Brother and Sister Adeline S. Sparks and Isabella Jane Sparks and should said property be more than sufficient for the support and education of said Brother Adeline S. Sparks and said Sister Isabella Jane Sparks until they are educated then all my said property I give and bequeath to them except the Silver Patch bequeathed to Noah W. Flood said Brother and Sister living in Washington County Georgia

3^d I desire that John S. Sparks and Thomas H. Sparks shall be Executors of this my last Will and testament John S. Sparks living in Putnam in Brooks County Georgia and Thomas H. Sparks living in Washington County Georgia This 20th day of March 1871
