I therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby
revoking an annulling all others heretofore made by me
Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in
a decent and Christian like manner suitable to the
circumstances and condition, my soul I trust shall
return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for
Eternal Salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ
Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named
as I am unwilling my Executor's should be delayed by
their rights, especially as there is no necessity for doing
Item 3rd I desire and direct that all my property not
heretofore given or bequeathed after my decease
out Item first and second of this Will be equally divided
Among my legal heirs
Item 4th I desire and direct that my Executor see that the property
heretofore given away be if not now turned over into the pos-
session of the persons to whom I have given it
Item 5th I constitute and appoint my worthy son-in-law
and friend Edwin Jackson Executor to this my last Will
and Testament, This June 6th 1879
