Know all men by these presents, that I Andrew McKenry of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and constitute this as my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I give and bequeath to John Wright Bothwell in trust for the sole and separate use of my Sister Catharine A Bothwell and her children Three Thousand Dollars by him to be invested for their benefit.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to My Ann Green my niece One Thousand Dollars.

Item 3rd I give to Mark Newman in trust for the sole use and benefit of Amanda Davis and her children all property both real and personal that I possess being and consisting of Houses & Lots in the City of Savannah & the Town of Swainsville the plantation containing twenty One hundred and fifty (2150) acres with the stock of Rules Horses & Hogs & plantation tools &c The rents and profits to be used by the said Amanda for the support & maintenance & Education of herself and her children so long as they remain at home except Mary & Georina wife of J. Fuller, Savanah.

It is my desire that the property in the City of Savannah shall not be sold at any time, but to be kept as a permanent investment & the rents & profits arising therefrom to be appropriated by the said Amanda Davis for her support and maintenance and the Education of her children (except as before excepted). And the said Trustee with the Consent of the said Amanda, shall have full power to sell and dispose of any of the property herein given in trust (except the Savannah property, and to reinvest the proceeds under the same uses and trusts as above mentioned without the intervention of the Court for that purpose.

Item - My Executors hereinafter mentioned are hereby empowered to sell to John T Youngblood, and make him a good valid title to the half of all the lands that I own adjoining Mr. Saffin the estate of Brimbley Harper & others containing twenty one hundred and fifty (2150) acres more or less upon his paying Seventeen hundred Dollars with interest from the Sixth day of November 1864 and paying up in full a mortgage I hold upon a Store house & Lot of Youngblood & Company in the Town of Swainsville formerly occupied by J. T. Youngblood & Co.

It is my desire that the farm carried on by myself and J. T. Youngblood be continued during the present year, and after paying all the expenses, the proceeds to be divided between myself and said J. T. Youngblood, that the part which shall fall to me be paid over to my Executors for the purpose of carrying out this Will. And should it be found impracticable

To Continue farming operations for the next year It is my desire that it be rented out to the best advantage for the benefit of the said Amanda Davis and her children.

I desire that my Executors do out of any funds that may be in hand after paying the special Legacies hereof given, do purchase a sufficient amount of good and substantial furniture and Household goods to furnish the House recently purchased of W.C. Matthews as a permanent Home for Amanda Davis and her family for their use and benefit in trust as heretofore

Nominate and appoint Mark Stearns & Amanda Davis as Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

Signed sealed declared and published by Andrew M Conky as his last Will and Testament in the presence of the undersigned who saw the Testator, Signs ~~sign~~ at his request this twenty fourth day of May 1868.
