I Andrew J. Pepiens of the County and State aforesaid being engaged in the service of my Country, knowing that life is uncertain that I may be called home in a short time is forth, desiring to arrange my worldly affairs while I have time and opportunity do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following manner by

Item 1st I leave unto my beloved mother Mary J. Pepiens during the term of her natural life all my property both real and personal and at her death it is my Will and I do hereby direct that the whole of my said property be equally divided between my Brothers and Sisters that may be living at the time of my death, and the children of those of them that may be dead at the time, (except the children of my deceased Sister Mary Plukes who I do not intend to be benefited out of my Estate) though it is not for the want of affection but that they are already well provided for

Item 2^d I do hereby nominate and appoint my Brother Joseph W. Pepiens Executor of this my last Will and Testament, And I do hereby revoke all former Wills by me heretofore made

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of May 1864

I Charles H. Sheppard of the State and County aforesaid being of sound mind and memory, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and knowing that I too must shortly depart from this world, do wish right and proper as respects myself and family, that I should make disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, and I therefore make this my last Will and Testament, revoking all other heretofore made by me

Item First, I desire and direct, that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and Condition. My soul I trust will return to God who gave it.

Item Second, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid, and that my remaining estate be divided equally among my children, to wit: Mary J. Sheppard, Charles H. Sheppard, and John H. Sheppard.
