Second. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly. I give bequeath and devise to Anna L Braswell daughter of my beloved wife Jane Braswell one Bed and furniture to her the said Anna L Braswell person.

Fourthly. I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Jane Bridge, wife of Alexander Bridge, and my beloved brother Washington H Peacock and their heirs all the balance of my personal estate, consisting of Mares Cattle Hogs Wagons Carts plantation tools farming utensils House hold and Kitchen furniture Clock and other things, that hath not been before mentioned, to them the said Nancy Bridge, and Washington H Peacock and their heirs forever.

Fifthly. I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Alexander Bridge, Executor of this my last Will and Testament this August 30th 1866.
