I, A. B. Thornton, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any and all Wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I give bequeath and devise to my wife Lucille J. Thornton for and during her life all my real and personal property of whatever kind it may consist of at the time of my death.

Item 2nd I will and direct that after the death of my said wife Lucille J., my daughter Emma Edna Thornton be first paid Fifty Dollars out of my estate, and the remainder to equally divide between my four children to wit: Emma Edna Thornton, James B. Thornton, W. B. Thornton and to Emma Leana and W. B. Thornton as Trustees for my son J. A. Thornton.

Item 3rd I further will and direct that after the death of said J. A. Thornton the above named Trustees make an equal division of his share among my remaining children then in life or to their legal heirs, etc. Item 4th I hereby constitute and appoint my daughter Emma Edna Thornton, together with and son W. B. Thornton Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
