I, A. B. Thornton of said State and County,
being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my
last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any and all Wills herebefore
made by me.

Item 1 I give bequeath and devise to my wife Annie C. Thornton
for and during her life all my real and personal property
of whatever kind it may consist of at the time of my death.

Item 2 I will and direct that after the death of my said wife
Lucille G. my daughter Emma Edna Thornton be first given
fifty Dollars out of my estate, and the remainder to equally divide
between my four children as will Emma Edna Thornton, James R.
Thornton, W. R. Thornton and W. Emma Anna and W. H. Thornton
as Trustees for my son J. A. Thornton.

Item 3 I further will and direct that within the death of said J. A. Thornton
the above named Trustees make an equal division of his estate
among my remaining children then in life or to their legal heirs, each.

Item 4 I hereby constitute and appoint my daughter Emma Edna
Thornton together with my son W. R. Thornton Executors of
this my last Will and Testament.
