

Mathew Moore, (will)

Johnson wife of Isaac Johnson of the County of Harris, the settlement whereon my said Daughter and her Husband Isaac Johnson now resides in the 28th District of Harris County, during her natural life for her support and maintenance and the support of her minor children, and at her death said land is to be sold by my executor to the highest bidder and the proceeds to be equally divided between my daughter Elizabeth Johnsons Children or their legal representatives

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my Grand Son Eugene M. Murry son of John M. Murry, the sum of thirty five hundred Dollars, six hundred and eighty five dollars and fifty one Cents of which he has already received, to be paid out of the effects of my Estate, and should it be necessary for me to advance him any more, it also is to be deducted from the aforesaid thirty five hundred Dollars

Item 5th The remainder of my Estate I bequeath to the children of my Brother Remond Moore of the County of Emanuel to be equally divided between them or their legal heirs

Item 6th I hereby constitute and appoint Isaac Whidden my Executor to carry out this my last Will and testament

Item 7 In case my Grand Son Eugene M. Murry should die without issue then I desire that his portion of my Estate go to the children of my Brother Remond Moore or their legal heirs

Georgia Washington County March the 28th 1863.

I Charles Sheppard of said State and County being in a right state of mind give and bequeath my property in the following manner

Item 1st I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid

Item 2 I give and bequeath to my beloved son Charles W. Sheppard one small Horse Colt and Sows and pigs

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my beloved son Hudson W. Sheppard one Iron Jolly and Sows and pigs

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my beloved son Zachariah J. Sheppard one Horse of the same value of those mentioned in the preceding items and one Sows and pigs

Item 5 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Ann J. Sheppard one small Calf and Sows and pigs

Item 6th I give and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth, all my lands, namely the lot in which I now live consisting of 200 acres, also one hundred acres known by the name of the Harris lot, and also the half

of one lot of land lying in Early County. Also I give to my beloved wife my negro man Amos and also my whole estate with the exception of the property which I have given to my beloved children and is mentioned in my will. This I give and bequeath with full power to dispose of the same at any time during her natural life as she may see proper.

Item 7. I now state that after the death of my wife that it is my Will that all my proper heirs shall have an equal share of what then remains.

Item 8. I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Executor to this my last Will and Testament. Also I leave it to her own option whether she chooses an Executor or not or who she chooses. This March 28th 1843
