I Cornelius Jordan of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a distribution of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

1st Item, I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in hope of salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

2^d Item, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed.

3rd Item, I give and bequeath and devise to my son Nathan H. Jordan and Alfred Y H Jordan and my two Daughters Hartly A D Jordan and Roberta H Jordan each one of them a Bedstead Bed and furniture, each one of them to select such as they wish to suit them selves out of my Bedds,

4th Item, I give bequeath and devise to my son Amos A Jordan Five Dollars in Money.

5th Item I give bequeath and devise to my son Alfred Y H Jordan a minor Five Hundred Dollars for to give him an Education and I appoint my son Nathan H Jordan Trustee for the said Alfred Y H Jordan.

6th Item - The residue of my property both real and personal, to be sold and equally divided among my children, to wit Catharine & Anna Jane H May, Louisa Ann Fulgham Stephen J Jordan Nathan H Jordan Cornelius Jordan Jr, Sarah E Wilson, Hartly A D Jordan, Roberta H Jordan & Alfred Y H Jordan after making them all equal with what I have given off to a portion of my said Children heretofore, Alfred Y H Jordan to share equal with the rest of my children. The Five hundred Dollars, that I give him is not to be counted in the division against him. 7th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my son Nathan H Jordan Dr John H May and my worthy friend William L Brown, executors of this my last Will and Testament this May 13rd 1870
