I do hereby give & devise all my Executor heretofore named, as soon as practicable sell all my personal property for the purpose of paying off my just debts and should the proceeds of all my personal property be insufficient to pay my debts, then I desire that so much of my real estate owned by me at the time of my death, be sold by my Executor for whatever of my indebtedness may remain unpaid.

I do hereby declare to sell any of my real estate I have no debt, I desire that whatever amount of my real estate should be sold, it be sold on that portion of my land lying on Chestnut Street in the City of Anderson.

Item Second I desire that my debts be paid, I desire and bequeath to my beloved daughter Charlotte I want, my entire estate whatever may remain and belong to her both real and personal.

Item Third I do hereby give and devise all my real and personal property to my daughter, my Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
