In the name of God Amen - I David H. Vinson of the County of Washington and State of Georgia, manifest that my present Physical debility and affliction will soon induce death, and now being of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs which I have strength so to do do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me at any time heretofore made and first looking to Jesus I Commit my Soul to God who gave it, and my worldly Estate I dispose as follows.

Item 1st I desire and direct all my just debts to be paid by my Executor herein named,

Item 2nd To my beloved Wife Barbara Vinson do I give and bequeath the 90 mudy acres ~~portion~~ of land on which I now reside and also the 60 Sixty acres adjoining the said Home land on the West and also a part of the tract known as the Duggan Place, that part or portion South of Spring Branch running through said tract South of the Waters extending from the mouth of Branch on Long Branch to Pine Corner in the end of the lane next to Mr John Garrett Together with all the farming implements One Sorel Mare and one Sorel Horse my Buggy and Harness with all other stock, belonging to the place unless it is discovered they are surplus, then they can be disposed of privately by my Executor, and the proceeds of which to be used for the benefit of the family and furthermore I bequeath to my beloved Wife all the Household and Kitchen furniture, all the said bequest do I intend my beloved Wife Barbara Vinson to hold during her Natural life or during her widowhood. The present Crop do I Will and intend to remain and be used to carry on the farm hereafter, and all the clear gains arising from the present Crop or from any Crop hereafter raised on said place, during her natural life or widowhood shall be subject to her need or necessity in any way, that the conducting of the farm may require. If my three sons hereafter named shall use industry and shall raise clear proceeds, and it be on hand at the death of my beloved Wife such proceeds are to be divided equally among them, but if either of them leave said place and is not engaged in farming on said land, such a one is not to have any of the proceeds after the time of his quitting. ^{Item 3rd} The part of the tract of land lying North of the Spring Branch "Waters line" "Corner now stand is to be used to the best advantage in the way of renting out, and the net proceeds arising therefrom is to be divided equally among my four Children namely H. V. Vinson, Ardealy F. Mills Wife of J. F. Mills, James A. Vinson and John H. Vinson.

Item 4th, At the death of my beloved Wife Barbara Vinson I desire my land to be divided equally among my four Children above named and also all my Household and Kitchen furniture, after my three sons shall have one Bed, and requisite Bed clothing each, the remainder of the property belonging to said place is to be equally divided between among my four Children, after my three sons have each a Horse Wain or Mule, such as may be found on the place at the death of my Wife. I constitute and appoint my Wife Barbara Vinson and my son Nathaniel F. Vinson as Executors to this my last Will.

I Henry Wood being of sound mind of disposing memory and of advanced age and being desirous of making a last disposition of my Estate, do make and constitute this as my last Will and Testament

Item 1st I give to my sons Matthew H Wood and John A Wood in trust for my Daughters Tabitha & Blenda Wife of Simon L Blenda and her children the land whereon I now reside known as the home tract containing two hundred and twenty (220) acres more or less, beginning at Cemetery Spring adjoining lands previously given to M H Wood, thence down Cemetery Spring thence to the Central Rail Road, thence on the Rail Road in a North Eastern direction to the point where the Eastern boundary line of the Lewis Place tract crosses said Rail Road, thence down said boundary line to where it crosses Sand Well Creek thence up said Well Creek to the mouth of the Branch West and nearest the head of that Creek the Rail Road runs Moys Hill, thence up said Branch to the head thence North $11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ across thence South 59° West $26^{\circ} 75'$ thence adjoining M H Wood's land to the beginning for and during her natural life and at her death to her children to be equally divided between them. Hereto be held in trust for her and her children exempt from the debts of her present or future husband said Valued at fourteen hundred dollars

Item 2^d I give to my son John A Wood in trust for the use and benefit of the children of my son William M Wood one lot of land & 60 in the 1st District of Lawrence County containing two hundred two and one half 200 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres and one hundred acres on Sand Well Creek in Washington County adjoining lands of Estate of Thomas E Hoyle & R Everett A Shorman and the heirs of said Lewis A Wood to be held in trust until the youngest child shall come of age or marry, thence to be equally divided between them share & share alike and at the time hundred dollars advanced to my son William M Wood during his life

Item 3^d I desire that all of my estate both real and personal of every description not herein before bequeathed or given off by deed of gift to my son Matthew H, John Westley and John A Wood, be given to my beloved Wife Francis Wood for and during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my children Matthew H Wood John Westley Wood John A Wood Tabitha & Blenda and the children of my son William M Wood and Danforth R Wood, the parties
