I Albert Souder of said county and State, being requested in person and in ill health, and being duly sworn to make a provision for the money worth and distribution of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this last last will and testament.

Item 2nd Let all my honest debts be paid.

Item 3rd I desire that all my property, real and personal, shall remain undistributed until each of my children shall have reached the age of majority.

Item 4th Should either my daughter Emma W. or Annie D. marry before majority, their claims for a subsistent out of my estate shall cease, as I hope they have a home, and a subsistent in their husbands and I make a provision for either of my sons Andrew L., John C., Charles J., Emory D. & William C.

Item 5th I empower my executors hereinafter named to sell or convey such of my personal property, as is necessary for the carrying on of the business of the farm and the support and education of the minor children.

Item 6th I desire that my wife Sarah C. shall have a home and subsistent out of the proceeds of produce made on my lands during her life or until the distribution hereinafter named.

Item 7th When my youngest son William C. shall have reached and my daughter Emma W. and Annie D. shall have married, then I desire that a distribution of all my property take place; each of my children and my wife Sarah C. sharing alike, provided my wife Sarah C. be allowed to

make her choice between dowry and child's part.
 Item 8th I hereby nominate my wife Sarah & Sister and my own Sister
 & Sister my Executors.

Whereas came in then Court Station at Gilmore, William A
 Smith and John De Richard, who being duly sworn, say that, Elbert Tucker
 being desirous of making disposition of his estate, made the foregoing dispo-
 sition of his property by verbal will and that he has here presented, contains
 his last requests and verbal dispositions of his property and that it is a just
 and true disposition as made before us, in all its parts and that the name
 of Annie & Shirling was also named by him as one of his daughters, to
 share in his estate and this Will was reduced to writing within thirty days
 from the time of making - that it was made during his last sickness, at his
 house of residence, where he resided ten days before his death, and he did
 not ask to take notice, that this was his Will at the time of pronouncing the
 same, or words to that effect.
