Fourth, I give devise and bequeath to my friends William A Thomas of the County of Chatham and Dr Horatio A Hollifield of the County of Washington and State aforesaid in trust for my three children now in life or any other child that may be born unto me by my beloved Wife Almecny, all the balance of my estate real and personal to be divided share and share alike, requesting my said friends William A Thomas and Dr Horatio A Hollifield trustees as aforesaid to see after the welfare of my said children while in minority, and divide the said property that may be left coming them as they may become of age or marry.

Fifth I hereby nominate and appoint my friends William A Thomas of Chatham County and Doctor Horatio A Hollifield Executors to this my last Will and Testament this 23rd day of January 1867.

Fifthly, I give bequeath and devise to my beloved Daughter in Law Warrill E Odum the remainder of my Household and Kitchen furniture not otherwise disposed of in the third item of this my last Will and Testament, also all of my farming utensils of every description is kind
