I Jasper W Evans late of Washington County being in sound mind but feeble in body do make this my last Will and Testament. First my will and desire is that my Mother Mrs Mary Blackburn, shall hold and retain in her possession for her special benefit, my plantation where she now resides with all the appurtenances thereto belonging during her natural life, and after my mother death to be sold and divided between my Brothers William & John.

2<sup>nd</sup> I also appoint and desire my Brother William J and William Green to take charge of the business and settle off all my just debts and the debts of my Mother.

3<sup>rd</sup> My desire is that after my Estate is fully settled up but the remainder after my Estate be equally divided between my Brother William J and John J Evans and Mary C. Percy and Rebecca Mulinda Blackburn, and in case either of the above legatees should die before a Settlement is made by my executors the distribution to be made with the survivors at that time of Settlement.

4<sup>th</sup> I also leave my Buggy for the convenience of my mother if she claims it, if not it is sold and proceeds divided as before stated equally.

I Elizabeth F. Burksdale of said State and County having the infirmity of human life, and that I may at any time depart from this world soon or right and proper both as respects myself and my family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annuling all others made by me.

My first desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and Conscience in my last Will shall remain to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal rest along through the blessed Eath and Heaven to Jesus Christ whose reign I have professed and humbly trust enjoyed for many years.

My second desire and direct all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinbefore named, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their rights especially as there is no receipt for debts.

My third I give and bequeath to my son William F in the sumnes herein specified, the tract of land on which I now reside containing one hundred and forty acres, to his own benefit and heirs for ever.

My fourth I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Hartill my sumnes being about sixteen years of age in the sumnes herein specified.

Item fifth I give and bequeath to my Grand children William & Henry Mary & Kennedy and Ann E. Kennedy in the manner hereafter specified  
Diligently to use the same for their own proper use and benefit.

Item sixth I desire and direct that the property above bequeathed  
be kept together in the house together with the Stock of Cows Hogs and  
one Horse and plantation tools and to be worked for the benefit of  
the family and to provide a home and support for my three grand  
children above named until the youngest one of them become of full  
years of age. Then desire and direct that the property be divided  
according to the following items.

Item seventh I give and bequeath to my son William E. if living at  
the time of the division of the property above named all the Stock  
of Cattle Hogs Horses plantation tools provision and all that belongs  
to the place, to his own proper use and benefit. But if he is not living at  
the time, I desire and direct that all the property mentioned in this item  
be sold and the proceeds divided between the children giving to my three  
Grand children above named an equal share.

Item eighth I constitute and appoint my son William E. and my wife  
Alice A. Bullock executors to this my last Will and Testament.

undisputed & go to my wife Elizabeth A. Bullock this  
17<sup>th</sup> day of June 1860.
