In the name of God Amen
I Elizabeth Ennett of said County and State, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but of advanced age and mindful that death awaits all the living, do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills and testaments heretofore made by me and especially a testamentary paper having the form of a deed to the children of Joseph Harrison of said County, State, dated on the 31st day of January A D eighteen hundred and forty five

Item 1 It is my Will and desire and I hereby direct that my debts if any I leave, be paid out money on hand at my if necessary, by sale of my personal property other than Slaves & if that be insufficient by hiring out my Slaves as long as may be requisite, I also wish my funeral Expenses paid in the same way.

Item 2 My Slave Hannah George Ann, Betsey Silby and her two children Mary & Margaret and all other property of which I may be possessed at my death after they payment of my debts and funeral Expenses I give and bequeath as follows, such portions thereof

as added to the appraised value at my death of a female slave named Penny heretofore conveyed by me to Charles J. Malone upon certain trusts, in the deed of Conveyance set forth, and the issue & increase of said Penny from since the making of said deed, (if any) shall be equal to one third the value of said Penny & her said issue (if any) then living, and of my estate in this 3^d I am disposed of I give and bequeath to Seaborn A. H. Jones of said County, upon the same trust, limitations and conditions as those created by and set forth in the said deed of Conveyance to said Charles J. Malone, the slave Penny and her increase as aforesaid if any, to be appraised under the order and direction of the Court of Ordinary of said County, And I hereby recognize and confirm said deed of Conveyance to said Charles J. Malone as trustee. The one half of all my estate which shall remain, after taking out the bequest to the said Seaborn A. H. Jones, as trustee as aforesaid I give and bequeath to Virgil Powers, the husband of my niece Ann E. Powers (formerly Jenkins), in trust for the support, comfort and maintenance of the said Virgil and Ann E. during their joint lives, and of the survivor of them, during his or her life, and upon the death of the survivor of them to be equally divided share and share alike among the children of the said Ann E. living at her death, and the children of such of her children as may have died before her, the latter to take by representation and not per capita, And should the said Virgil die before the said Ann E. my will is that this trust devolve upon her.

All that shall remain of my estate after paying debts and funeral expenses, and satisfying the bequests in trust to Seaborn A. H. Jones & Virgil Powers, I give and bequeath to Joseph Harrison of said County in trust for the support, comfort and maintenance of the said Joseph and his wife during their joint lives, and of the survivor during his or her natural life and after the death of such survivor one third thereof to Lewis Harrison, son of the said Joseph & the remaining two thirds to be equally divided share and share alike among the other children of the said Joseph Harrison living at my death. And should the said Joseph Harrison die before his said wife, my will and desire is that this trust thereby created shall devolve upon his said son Lewis.

Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint the said Seaborn A. H. Jones & Virgil Powers Executors of this my last will and testament.
