I therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

Item 1: I desire and direct my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner suitable to my circumstances in life, my soul, I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the Second Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Item 2: I desire and direct, that all my just debts be paid, without delay, by my executors hereafter named and appointed.

Item 3: I give and bequeath to my second daughter Nancy J Higgins and Mary J Higgins all my kitchen and household furniture which I may be seized and possessed of at the time of my death, in order to enable them even till what I have heretofore given to my other children.

Item 4: It is my Will and desire that all the property I may have at the time of my death, be equally divided, between my beloved children (except what has already been devised) to share and share alike.

Mary J and Nancy A Higgins and Susan Spirling wife of William A Spirling, Elizaairy Bell wife of John Bell, Chargian Kelley wife of George W Kelley Jr, and beloved sons Joel J Higgins, Arthur D Higgins and the heirs of my son Asaphorus J Higgins to share and share alike.

Item 5: That there shall be no question of this Will so construed as to deprive any of my children of anything heretofore given to them by me.

Item 6: I hereby constitute my son Arthur D Higgins and my daughter Nancy A Higgins and Mary J Higgins, Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.

and Testament.

I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Ellafair G Bell, formerly
Ellafair G Higgins, Amanda H Higgins and Mary E Higgins, my entire
estate both real and personal for and during their natural lives or while
they remain unmarried and should either marry or die I desire that the
remaining ones, to have the sole charge until their marriage or death. And I
further will, that on the death or marriage of my three daughters mentioned above
then my property both real and personal, to be equally divided between all my
children share and share alike. I further will that the Corpus of my estate
be only as a life estate or during their single and unmarried states, not giving
them the right to sell and dispose of the real estate. I further will that my
Grand daughter Shamie M Bell do receive a subshort during her life, or while
she should marry. Should any daughter Ellafair G Bell marry again, it is my
desire, that the daughter of her body Shamie M Bell do not receive the benefits
mentioned in this my Bequest. I desire that this last named Bequest do not pre-
vent the payment of all my just debts by my executors named in the Will.
