I, Simon Drantley, of the County of Washington and State of Georgia, being now feeble in health, but of sound and withstanding mind and memory, do publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament and I hereby revoke all former wills.

Item 1st It is my will and desire that my daughter Thomas S. Greer, wife of George Greer or her children or heirs have no interest whatever in any of my property real or personal of which I may die seized and possessed or entitled.

Item 2nd It is my will and desire, that my grandson Charles Drantley, son of my deceased son Frank have no interest whatever in any of my property real or personal of which I may die seized and possessed or to which I may be entitled.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Ann who has been faithful and true to me in my old age - all that tract or parcel of land situated in the 95th District N.W. of said county and bounded on the south by the Sim branch on the east by lands of Zach J. Drantley Junior, on the north by lands of Mrs. Maria Chap Drantley and on the west by lands of Mrs. Maria Chap Drantley and John Shaulding. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife three beds and bedding and the two bedside tables in my dressing room, my mirror and wigged, one set of chairs; all the keys we now own belong to my wife. I have placed over to her, her share of the cattle and the gift is now confirmed. I give to her my bureau and wardrobe now in my dressing room. It is my will that the foregoing bequests to my wife, be in full of all her claims upon my estate.

Item 4th It is my will and desire that all the remainder of my property which I now possess, or to which I may be entitled to, be divided into five equal parts. One of said parts, I give and bequeath to my son, in law E. B. Dudley in Trust for his wife George Dudley and his children free from his or their present or future debts or liabilities. Another of said parts I give to my son Zach J. Drantley in Trust for his wife and children and, the remaining three parts, I give, one part each to my children Dennis Heath, Susan Smith and Mary Louisa Dudley.

Item 5th I nominate and appoint my son Zach J. Drantley and my son in law E. B. Dudley as Executors of this my Will. I also nominate and appoint Attorney and friend Richard J. Harris one of the Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

I, William L. Anderson of said State and County, being
of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testa-
ment.

Item 1st I give, bequeath and devise to my daughter Martha E. L. Anderson
the following property to wit: One hundred acres of land, known as
the Hornethead place. Also one mile and one hundred and fifty bushels of corn
set aside for her and her mother free from all charge and limitation whatever
to her own proper use, benefit and behoof.

Item 2^d I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Mary Howard the follow-
ing property to wit: Twenty acres of land, bounded on the south by
Cuthran, with an additional twenty acres of land at her house during her
life, and at her death to her body heirs, free from all charge or limitation
to her own proper use, benefit and behoof.

Item 3^d I give, bequeath and devise to my son John L. Anderson, twenty
acres of land, known as the Hornethead place, with an additional
twenty acres at his house to his own proper use, benefit and behoof.

Item 4th I give, bequeath and devise to my son Erano H. Anderson eight
acres more or less of land bounded on the north by C. C. Collins
on the north west by C. C. Gilbert with an additional twenty acres of land
with or at his house to his own proper use benefit and behoof.

Item 5th I give bequeath and devise to my son W. J. Anderson, fifty three
acres of land, bounded on the south by Cuthran, on the east by
C. Erano with an additional two acres at his house to his own proper
use, benefit and behoof.

H. Anderson, Annie Anderson, and Annie Ann Anderson
