Known all men, that I Hattie C. Durlow of said County and State, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament.

Item I. I give bequeath and devise to Samuel J. Long of said State and County, as trustee for my daughter Hattie Lyttie Durlow one house and lot in the city of Sanderson, county and State aforesaid, containing one and one half acres more or less, fronting and bounded on South by Haynes street, on the east by an alley, north by the old Academy lot now belonging to Forttman and Duggan, and on the West by Samuel J. Long, with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, to have and to hold, and premises to have as aforesaid until the said Hattie Lyttie Durlow shall arrive at the age of twenty one years at which time the tract herein created and the property hereby devised shall become the absolute property of the said Hattie Lyttie Durlow.

Item II. I further devise and direct that the said Samuel J. Long trustee shall immediately on my death take possession of the premises bequeathed to the aforesaid Hattie, rent the same as otherwise manage, and pay the rents issues, and profits for the use and benefit of the said Hattie Lyttie Durlow during her minority or as his discretion may be deemed most advisable.

Item III. I constitute and appoint my brother Samuel J. Long executor of this my last Will and Testament and it is my wish and will, that he should be required of him as Executor or trustee, nor that he be required to make the annual Returns required by law of Executors to Court of Ordinary.

Item IV. I further devise, give and bequeath, any and all other property not so fully disposed of to Samuel J. Long as trustee for Hattie Lyttie Durlow when she comes of age and uses as indicated in the first and second items of this my last Will.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint to Henry Wilson, husband of my beloved daughter Rebecca, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
