the following as my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annihilating any
and all other hitherto made by me.

Item 1st I will and direct that all my just debts be paid.

2^d I give and bequeath to my sister Melinda Taylor, all the property which
I may have at my death for and during her natural life, and at her death to
be equally divided between any children she may leave and Claudia A. Taylor
daughter of my brother William C. Taylor deceased equal share and share alike
for children. And if the said Melinda should leave no children living
then the entire property to go to my said niece Claudia Taylor.

Item 3^d If both, the said Melinda and Claudia should die leaving no children
living, I desire and direct that the whole of my property shall revert to
and return to my Estate, to be distributed among my relatives according to
laws for distribution of Estates.

Item 4th I desire and direct that a comfortable support and maintenance be
provided out of my Estate for my mother during her life and I charge the
executors in the foregoing Items with her support.

Item 5th I nominate and appoint my friends Dr. A. Mathis, Horace D. Adams
and Bennett Hecht Executor of this my will.

J. Henry Taylor being still of sound mind and memory do make and publish this Codicil to my last Will and Testament above set forth.

I hereby change my Will and Testament as follows: to wit:

Item 1. I give, devise and bequeath to my friend Horace D Adams in trust for the sole and separate use of said Victoria Hills, my tract of land in said County known as the Brugge place, lying on the East of Little Reg Creek, containing fifty acres more or less, bounded on the South East by lands of A. W. Jackson, on the north and east by the Estate of Daniel Hills deceased and on the West, by my lands, the line on this side being on Little Reg Creek.

In the event of the death of said Ida Victoria, leaving no children at the time of her death, then and in that case the said tract of land to revert back to my estate, and be distributed subject to the terms, conditions and limitations of the 2^d Item of said last Will and Testament.

Item 2^d. As the tract of land given and bequeathed in the first Item of this Codicil to my last Will, will be insufficient for the support and education of the said Ida Victoria, I hereby desire and direct, and it is my will, that the executors of my said Will and who are herein named as the Executors of this Codicil hereto, do pay over annually, from the income of my Estate, bequeathed in the said Item 2^d, of my said Will to the said Horace D Adams, Trustee for the said Ida Victoria, a sum of money sufficient in their judgment, when added to the income from the land given her in the first Item of this Codicil, for her support and education of the said Ida Victoria. In determining what sum they pay over the said trustee for the support and education of the said Ida Victoria, my Executors will exercise a sound discretion and take into consideration the condition and circumstances of my estate and the other charges hereto imposed in my said Will.

Item 3^o. I change Item 3^o of my said Will so as to read as follows.

If both the said Matilda and Claudia should die leaving no children, and leaving the said Ida Victoria then surviving, I give and bequeath to the said Horace D Adams in trust for the sole use of the said Ida Victoria so surviving the whole of my property and estate. In the event of the said Ida Victoria so surviving and in the event that the said Ida Victoria should die leaving no children, then I will that all my property shall revert back to my Estate and be distributed among my relatives according to the Statute of Distribution.

Item 4^o. I nominate Dr. C. Shatto, Horace D Adams and A. S. Brooks Executors of this Codicil to my said Will. In testimony whereof I have this day set my hand and seal. Dated the 15th day of May 1881.
