1st After my debts are all paid, I give bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Ami Mayo - should she survive me - all my property both real and personal of whatever description, to have full power to control as she may see proper.

2^d Should I survive my wife Ami Mayo, then I order and direct my executors herein after described at my death or as soon thereafter as practicable after paying all debts and after paying themselves for their trouble and expense as the law would direct, to equally divide the remainder among my lawful heirs.

3^d I hereby nominate and appoint Green B. Harrison and Rufus J. Cochran as Executors to the above Will and Testament.

4th I nominate and appoint the said Green B. Harrison and Rufus J. Cochran as trustees for my grandson McAoren Underwood for and during his minority.
