Know all men by these presents, that I Eliza Ann Armstrong of the county of Washington and State of Georgia considering the uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and memory, do make, declare and publish that my last Will and Testament

1st It is my desire and wishes that all my debts should be paid as speedily as possible without selling any of my estate, unless it be a purpose of heritable property not necessarily needed.

2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother A. C. Armstrong a home during his natural life and the use, benefits and income of my entire estate as much as is required to give him comfort in health - and other attention that may be required during sickness.

3^d After the death of my beloved brother A. C. Armstrong, I give and bequeath unto my beloved nieces, Elizabeth J. Farmer and Anna Eliza Armstrong the sum of two hundred Dollars to each one of these and that the graves of my beloved mother and myself and brother A. C. Armstrong be well fenced with iron, and other work done to our graves that my Executor hereinafter named may think necessary.

4th It is my request that my Executor hereinafter named see that no other person or persons is supported out of the income of my estate, but my brother A. C. Armstrong.

5th It is my request that after the above provisions of my Will and Testament have been carried out, that my Executor hereinafter named divide the remainder of my estate between the children of my brothers and sisters each one to share alike and if any of them contest this Will they forfeit their interest in my estate.

I do nominate and appoint J. S. Garner Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
