In the name of God Amen

I Isaac Coleman of the County of Hancock and State of Georgia being in perfect health at present and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz First, I bequeath my Soul to god that giveth to me, My body to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executors,

Item as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner, First that all my just debts be honorably paid

I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Ann Coleman a loan during her natural life or Widowhood, all my Estate both real and personal, and at the death of my beloved Wife Ann Coleman the property above ceded to be equally divided between my Children Seven in Number Sally Thomas, Charles, David Washington, Isaac Jefferson and James Gordon Coleman,

I give and bequeath to my loving daughter Nancy Sherman two Dollars Cash, I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Nancy Sherman's Children to be equally divided among them at the time they arrive at lawful age the sum of two hundred Dollars Cash and do hereby nominate my loving Sons Thomas & David Coleman Executors of this my last Will and Testament

In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12th day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventeen
