Testament, revoking any and all Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my brother Sidney E. Taylor (150) one
hundred and fifty acres of my land including improvements
known as the Paul Beckrich place.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my brother William E. Taylor 50 Acres
of my land joining Gabriel Williams and also my share of the

sheep.
Item 3 I will and direct that all my household property including horses,
hogs, gin and running gear, cart and yoke of oxen and buggy
be sold and the proceeds go to pay all my debts.

Item 4th I will and direct that the proceeds of my crop be used with Item 1
and after my debts are paid I direct that my brother Sidney E.
Taylor buy three Tombstones for my father, mother and myself.

Item 5th I direct that a tract of land now over after the Tombstones are bought
that it must be equally divided among my brothers and sisters.

Item 6th I hereby appoint my brother Sidney E. Taylor, executor of this my
Will and Testament.
