Item Third: I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Julia G. Hatch, Executor, and my beloved wife Mary A. Coontrid, of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me. Witness my hand and seal this 31<sup>st</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety two.
