

# John Braddy Will,

State of Georgia

Washington County In the name of God Amen

I John Braddy of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me before make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

1<sup>st</sup> Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose Religion I have professed as I humbly trust enjoyed for nearly eight years.

2<sup>d</sup> Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors, herein after appointed, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights, especially as there is no necessity for delay.

3<sup>d</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my son Oliver R Braddy one hundred acres of land wherein he now lives, adjoining Cuttum and Watson, and others with all the rights, members and franchises, to said land, in any wise appertaining or belonging thereto.

4<sup>th</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my two Sons, to wit James S and Daniel R Braddy two hundred acres of land adjoining Henry Walker and others to be equally divided between the two, with all the rights, members and franchises, to said land in any wise appertaining or belonging for ever.

5<sup>th</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my son Andrew Braddy one hundred and forty acres of land wherein he now lives lying and being on the waters of the Big Oconee adjoining Watson and others with all the rights, members and franchises, to said land in any wise appertaining or belonging forever.

6<sup>th</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my two Sons, to wit James S and Franklin W R & Braddy three hundred acres of land wherein I now live lying on the waters of the Big Oconee adjoining Marion and others to be equally divided between the two Boys with all the rights, members and franchises, to said premises, of said land in any wise appertaining or belonging forever.

7<sup>th</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my four Daughters to wit Susanna Smith wife of Jonathan Smith, and Cleopas and and Martha Ann and Sarah E F L Braddy, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Emanuel County, and that aforesaid containing five hundred acres adjoining Willis Johnson and J F Fortune and others, with all the rights, members and franchises, to said land in any wise appertaining or belonging forever.

8<sup>th</sup> Item I give bequeath and devise to my three daughters, to wit

10 Item - I desire that my Executors will keep all my Stock  
together as it is till my two minor children become of age, and then  
divide them between them, that is, had none off, and I desire that  
my two minor children be scholars, and when the two minor become  
of age, my daughter Elephant Ann is to have my Bay Horse

11 Item - I hereby constitute and appoint my Son Oliver B. Brandy  
my Executor of this my last Will and Testament, this December 6<sup>th</sup> 1854.

GEORGIA

Washington County In the Name of God Amen

This eleventh day of August 1848.

I Moor Price of the County and State aforesaid being well  
in body & health & of sound disposing mind & memory & calling  
to mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed  
unto men once to die, do make and declare this my last Will and  
Testament. I commend my soul into the hand of God that gave it  
me & my body I recommend to the earth from whence it came to be buried  
in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executrix  
& as touching the worldly goods wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me  
with in this life after my just debts and funeral Expenses being  
first paid, I give and devise of in the following manner from & by  
Item 1<sup>o</sup> I give to my son John Price the sum of one Dollar  
to him and his heirs forever

Item 2<sup>o</sup> I give to my daughter Nancy Price the sum of one  
Dollar to her & her heirs forever

Item 3<sup>o</sup> My will and desire is that all the balance of my estate  
both real and personal consisting of lands, Houses, Cattle Hogs
