1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and Condition in life, My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal Salvation, through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose Religion I have professed as I humbly but enjoyed for nearly Eight years

2^d Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors, hereinafter appointed, as I am unwilling my Creditors should be delayed in their rights, especially as there is no necessity for delay

3^d Item, I give bequeath and devise to my Son George B Braddy one hundred acres of land, whereon he now lives, adjoining Callow and Watson, and others with all the right, member and privileges, to said land, in anywise appertaining or belonging forever.

4th Item I give bequeath and devise to my two Sons, to wit James and Daniel B Braddy two hundred acres of land adjoining Henry Walker and others to be equally divided between the two, with all the right, member and privileges, to said land in anywise appertaining or belonging forever.

5th Item, I give bequeath and devise to my son Andrew B Braddy one hundred and forty acres of land whereon he now lives, lying and being on the waters of the Big Choopie adjoining Watson and others with all the right, member and privileges, to said land in anywise appertaining or belonging forever.

6th Item - I give bequeath and devise to my two Sons, to wit Jordan B and Franklin M B Braddy, three hundred acres of land whereon I now live lying on the waters of the Big Choopie adjoining Mason and others, to be equally divided between the two Boys with all the right, member and privileges, to said premises, of said land in anywise appertaining or belonging forever.

7th Item - I give bequeath and devise to my four Daughters to wit Sarah Smith wife of Jonathan Smith, and Eliza and Martha Ann and Sarah E F L Braddy, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Emanuel County, and State of Georgia, containing five hundred acres, adjoining Miller, Johnson and J F Porter, and others, with all the right, member and privileges, to said land in anywise appertaining or belonging forever.

8th Item I give bequeath and devise to my three Daughters, to wit

Braddy one Bed and furniture each one with all the right members and privileges to said Beds and furniture; in anywise appertaining or belonging forever of them, I give bequeath and devise to my two sons to wit Jordan B and Franklin M. A. Braddy one Bed and furniture each one, with all the rights and members and privileges to said Beds and furniture in anywise appertaining or belonging forever

10th Item - I desire that my Executors will keep all my stock together as it is till my two minor children become of age, and then divide them between them (that has had none off) and I desire that my two minor children be scholars, and when the two minors become of age my daughter Elephair Ann is to have my bay Horse

11th Item - I hereby constitute and appoint my son Oliver B Braddy my Executor of this my last will and testament; this December 6th 1854

I recommend my soul into the hands of God that give it me & my body I recommend to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, at the direction of my Executors as touching the worldly goods, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life after my just debts and funeral expenses being first paid, I give and dispose of in the following manner

Item 1st I give to my son John Price the sum of one Dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item 2nd I give to my daughter Nancy Price the sum of one Dollar to her & her heirs forever

Item 3rd My will and desire is that all the balance of my Estate both real and personal consisting of lands Horses Cattle Hogs
