The last Will and testament of Moses Robison was proven and recorded at September Term of the Court of Ordinary (of Washington County) 1850 which original and copy record of said Will was destroyed by fire in Sandersonville on the 24 day of March 1855, a copy of which was established and recorded at November term 1857 from a copy attached to the letter testamentary granted to the Executors.

In the name of God Amen I John Covington of Washington County and State of Georgia being of sound and perfect mind and memory Glorify God do this the twenty first day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty four Make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner following that is to say, First I bequeath to my beloved Wife Eliza Covington during her natural life, the plantation which I now live, containing two tracts in all, there being three hundred and forty acres with the improvements thereon, also her negro fellows Isaac and Silas and a Negro woman named Betty and all the household and kitchen furniture five cows and calves twelve head of sheep two horses such as she may choose, also my riding gig, and as many plantation utensils as she may think necessary for the farm, which property at the decease of my wife, I do hereby give unto the child or children which we may have, if any ~~children~~ ~~of any~~ we have, until they receive an equal proportion with the rest of the other children which are hereafter mentioned the remainder if there be any to be equally divided among all my children.

Item I give to my daughter Mary and Charles Fisher her husband the property before given into their possession by two hundred acres of land in which they now live on, one negro girl named Olive three cows and calves one sow and piggs, one feather bed and furniture one year provision, some Corn and meat which they have had.

Item I give to my daughter Charlotte and her husband John Webb the property before given into their possession by two hundred & eleven acres of land in which they now live on, one negro girl named Rachel one cow and calves one sow and piggs one feather bed and furniture and one year provision some Corn and meat which they have had.

Item I give to my daughter Harriett and her husband John Fisher

the property before given unto them possession viz two hundred acres of land on which they now live, one negro girl named Comfort, three Cows and Calves, one Sow and piggs, one feather bed and furniture and one year provision and some meat and corn which they have had. I give to my daughter Martha and her husband Samuel Webb, the property before given unto their possession viz one hundred and ninety acres of land on which they now live, one negro girl named Amy, two Cows and Calves one Sow and piggs one feather bed and furniture and one year provision and some Corn and meat which they have had

Item I give to my daughter Sarah two hundred acres of land adjoining Sam Webb, & negro girl named Abby three Cows and Calves, one Sow and piggs one feather bed & furniture & fifty Dollars in cash

Item I give to my daughter Malinda two hundred acres of land adjoining her Sister Sarah, one negro Boy named John three Cows and Calves and two piggs one feather bed & furniture and fifty Dollars in cash

Item - I give to my daughter Peggy Ann two hundred acres of land adjoining her Sister Malindas one negro girl named Luiza three Cows and Calves one Sow and piggs one feather bed and furniture and fifty Dollars in cash. The balance of my property now in my possession & that which I may have at the death of my Mother after paying for the education of those children that are not educated. I do hereby give and bequeath equally to all of my children

Item I hereby make and declare my wife Eliza Covington John Webb and Charles Fisher Executors to this ~~to~~ my last Will and Testament

I witness whereof, I the said John Covington have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and the day and year above written
