John C Smith's Non Capitive Will

I would refer you all to Dr. Boatwright now present as my attending Physician that in my present Condition I am incapable of executing my Will in writing. I wish you all to bear witness that this is my last Will and Testament and that I am sound in mind.

I leave all that I am possessed of after paying my just debts, to my wife in trust for the benefit of herself and our Children.

I make my Brother Alexander Smith and my friend William H Armstrong my Executors

I instruct my Executors to use their best judgment in the management of my affairs and desire my property to be kept so far as possible together. I wish my Executors to do as their judgment deems for each of my Children as they Marry off in equal proportion and only giving as much as in their judgment with the consent and approval of my wife they deem can be spared from the support of my wife and other Children.

I would call special attention of my executors to the fact that I do not desire to make any special provision, whereby I might show any preference to any one of my children for I wish to do equally by all but I would call their attention to the fact that Harry is a great exertion and Willie also to a less degree are afflicted and may therefore in the future demand better provision to place them on an equal footing with the others. This I leave at their discretion of my Executors and wife.

In the writing up of the estate of my Father for whom I acted as Administrator, I yet owe a balance of two hundred Dollars Confederate Money, this is a small matter which I wish settled in H. C. Lumney's account, the debt due by the equitable established for such cases on the basis of valuation of Confederate money and H. C. Lumney at the time the Confederate money was received. This will place me even with the estate of my Father which I Administrated. And I call all present either to reject or receive this statement now together with the other items of my will.

With regard to my farm Turnips the entries in my farm Books for and against my Croppers are complete and accurate with the single exception that I have omitted to make two entries, One Cm sold Eller for twelve \$12.00 Dollars, and one Cm sold to Jordan for fifteen \$15.00 Dollars for which they are to be charged,
