I John S. Long of the County and State aforesaid, being of a
sound and disposing mind and memory, but knowing the uncertainty of
life do publish and declare this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking and annulling all former Wills by me made,

Item 1st It is my will and desire that my body be returned to its mother
earth in a Christian burial under the direction of my sister Margaret
Jeffers my brother Richard H. Long and my Sister Sarah R. Rembert
who know my views on this subject, but are freely directed to do just
as they please, And I trust that my soul will return to God who gave
it to enjoy eternal happiness.

Item 2nd I give to my Sister Margaret Jeffers the following property to
wit old Reddick, little Reddick, Peter Nick Mary, Patsy, Clara, Charles
and Henry my Waggoner. These servants have either wife or husband
on my said Sisters plantation or that of my niece Alberta Miller
and I give them to my sister in Order that they may not be separated.

Item 3rd I give to my nephew Nicholas S. Long in trust for my
brother Richard H. Long during his lifetime the following property
to wit, Sarah, Louisa, Littleton Madison, George, Jackson, Edmund
Patty, Emanuel, Patience Sandy, Elizabeth and her two children
Roxan and Patty, and at the death of my brother Richard, it is my
will and desire that my said nephew as trustee as aforesaid shall
then make an equal division of said negroes, and their increase
between the children of my niece Rebecca Battigill daughter of my

as my Brother Richard, the said trustees apportioning debts to each for their respective shares at the time of said division. it being my purpose to entitle the fee simple of said property in said children of my deceased wife. the said Richard Battall

Item 4th I give to my sister Sarah Rebecca Remond select of James Remond late of Tennessee deceased forever in fee simple the following property to wit Honey, Polly, Lucy, Fancer, Ralph Robt, Rosetta, Frank Daphney wife of Frank, Ann, Orlando, Estate, Anthony William Lipes, Ned, Sylvia, Larina, Moses, Spencer and Suky. The said negro to be her own property with their increase absolutely and forever and to be disposed of she may see fit

Item 5th I give to my nephew William J. Weems the son of my deceased Sister Eugenia the following property in trust for his children now in life or that may hereafter be born to him to wit Old Peggy Matthew, Rebecca, little Peggy and her child George, Elephair and her two children Lemuel and Mary, Robert or Bob a blacksmith, Francis, the Blacksmith, and Delphia his wife, Sam, Cherry Anna, Chloe, Nicholas, Nathaniel, Lester and Ellick and Flora his wife and her two children. The said property to be controlled by my said nephew as trustee as aforesaid for the support and education of his said children, and the overplus for his own use and benefit during his life not touching the Corpus of the property or its increase, it being my purpose to vest these absolutely in fee simple in his children

Item 6th I give to my nephews Nicholas A Long and Felix G Long in trust for my niece Ann Pierce the daughter of my brother Richard H Long during her natural life free from the use and control of her husband in any manner. the following property to wit Maria and her two children Fulina and Anna, and their increase to be held in trust as above for the sole and separate use of my said niece until her death when said property and its increase are to vest absolutely in fee simple in her children. but if she shall die leaving no child or children at the time of her death then it is my will and desire that said property be equally divided between said Nicholas A Long and Felix G Long

Item 7th I give to Nicholas A Long in trust for Margarett Long daughter of my nephew Thomas T Long and Theodosia his late wife the following property to wit Levin, Hannah and her infant child and should Margarett Long die leaving at the time of her death no child or children then it is my will and desire that said property vest absolutely in her father the said Thomas T Long.

Item 8th I give to my nephews Nicholas A Long the following property to wit, Jim and my maw and Colt to be his own property absolutely and forever in fee simple

Item 9th It is my will and desire that my executors herein after to be named (if they shall find it necessary for the payment of my debts) shall sell Bonn Augustus and Felix and if any overplus after settling or if not necessary to sell them to pay debts still to see who will divide the funds arising from their sales equally between Nicholas A Long, Felix G Long, Lewellen Remond, Thomas T Long and William J Weems

Item 10th It is my will and desire that my plantation and all the residue of my estate whether in land or perishable property be sold by my executors hereinafter to be known as and applied with all reasonable disbursements to the payment of my debts, and after the paying off of said debts, then it is my will and desire that the surplus, if any, be equally divided between my nephews Nicholas A Long, Thomas J Long, Lavelton Rembert Ellis G Long and William J Meems.

Item 11th I hereby nominate and appoint Nicholas A Long, William J Meems & Lavelton Rembert Executors of this my last will and testament.
