In the event of the death of said Son without issue, then I desire that all the remaining property be divided by my Executors herein after named in two equal shares, one half of which shall go to my relatives of the Rugeley family and the other half to be equally divided amongst the following institutions

The Baptist Church at Whites in this County, the Methodist, Baptist and Christian Churches of Andersonville and the Andersonville Public School.

5. I hereby appoint my good friends, L. R. Pringle & W. H. Whitaker and W. L. Orr Executors of this my Will

Signed, declared and published this as my last Will and Testament this 23rd of June 1862.
