I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others, by me heretofore made.

Item 1. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner, according to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust will return to God who gave it.

Item 2. I desire that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named.

Item 3. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Foster and Thirce Gault, a box I have purchased from an auctioneer, jointly my part of land lying in said County, containing Eighty Two acres more or less, adjoining lands of Abner Hubbard, on both sides and on the other side of land of Nathaniel Luggan.

Item 4. It is my will and desire, that my Executor hereinafter named pay over to each of my daughters, Mrs. Gault, except Mary who to my son George. My Executors may order my debt as they see fit to be realized from the real and personal estate of my estate.

Item 5. I give and bequeath to my daughter John Harriet Robinson all of household and furniture, and during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided amongst all of my children share and share alike.

Item 6. I give and bequeath to my son John Robinson all of the property of which I may be seized by, interest at the time of my death except the property bequeathed in the foregoing items. It is my will and desire that my said wife remain at the home of my son John, and be supported by him during her natural life free of charge.

Item 7. I hereby constitute and appoint my friend and friend Stephen B. Mills Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
