Washington County } In the name of God Amen

I John Webb, of the State and County aforesaid, being in a feeble state of health but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be unto God, calling to mind, the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for man once to die, do make and order in this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God who gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be decently buried in a Christian like manner, at the discretion of my Executors and friends, And touching this Estate wherein it hath pleased God to bestow me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner.

Item 1st - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Charlott Webb during her natural life the following property, viz: the House and plantation on the South side of Duck Eye Creek, with the exception of no lands to be cleared, also three negroes, viz: Simon Hannah and Jacob, also her Horse, her choice, also five Cows and Calves of her choice, out of all my Stock two Sows and piggs with ten other Shoats, of her choice, with as much land as she think fit, and Kitchen furniture as she think, will do her, with as much provision for one year as she and my Executors think will take to do her, also my Horse cart, and her old plow given by her in part of her choice.

Item 2^d, I give to my Daughter Sarah Webb the plantation and tract of land where she now lives in, also my tract of land in Washington County, one mare which she now has in possession, and one Cow and calf and one yearling, one bed and bedstead and furniture and table and stool which they now have in possession.

Item 3^d, I give to my son John C. Webb, my tract of land where he now lives in, containing one hundred and ninety acres more or less, the Creek to be the line, beginning at the lower end continuing up the upper part against the Worthington old field, one Horse and saddle, one bed and bedstead and furniture and trunk and table and one Saw.

Item 4th - I give to my daughter Elizabeth Webb one bed and bedstead and furniture one trunk, saddle and Saddle,

Item 5th - I give to my daughter Martha Webb one bed and bedstead and furniture one trunk, saddle and Saddle.

Item 6th - I give to my daughter Malinda Webb one trunk,

Item 7th - I give to my daughters Elizabeth and Martha and Malinda the balance of my land on the North side of Duck Eye Creek and it to be equally divided between them three.

Item 8th - I give to my son Joseph Webb at the death of my wife the House and land which I have leased her, at her death.

Item 9th, I give to the two children of my daughter Mary Hannah, viz: Daniel and John, my tract of land of Eschiel Daniel, also my bunch of cattle to be sold there, now in the care of Samuel Redwood, the cattle to be sold and the money put at interest.

Item 10th - I give the balance of my negro property not otherwise disposed of to my children Sarah Smith, John L Webb, Elizabeth Webb Martha Webb Malinda Webb, Joseph D Webb, Crawford Webb and the two children of Mary Hamiltons deceased, to have one share the share which their mother would have been entitled to provided she had lived

Item 11th My old negro man Simon must be supported by the above negro property which are given to all of my children

Item 12th - The balance of my property after giving of my son Joseph D Webb a tolerable good English education, all the said remaining part of my property not otherwise disposed of goods and chattels to be equally divided between Sarah Smith, John L Webb, Elizabeth Webb Martha Webb Malinda Webb, and Joseph D Webb, and if any money for it likewise to be equally divided between the above named heirs in item 12th

Item 14th - After the death of my Wife the negro property given to her to be equally divided between all of my children my grand children excepted, the balance of said property I give to the children mentioned in item 12th and it to be equally divided

Item 15th - Out of the property of item 12th I desire my children to all be made equal before the property is all divided, if any of the above named children should die without issue, the property to return and be equally divided between all my children except my grand children and if one of them should die without an issue the property to be held by the other, if both should die without issue the property then to return and be equally divided between all of my children

Item 16th It is my will and desire that Rufus Hamilton the father of said Grand children should never have any part or parcel of my estate in his management

Item 17th - My books to be equally divided among all of my children. I do hereby make and declare Simon Webb my sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament will made by me
