money shall then be distributed equally among the other six shares herebefore named as if it had been each share the value of a share.

Item 6th If my wife Mary S. Youngblood shall in my presence think it necessary for her proper support and maintenance to interpell when the capital that half of my real estate given to her for life only, after having used that half given to her in fee simple, then it is my will and desire that she shall do as to such an extent as she in her discretion deems necessary. It being my will and desire, that my said wife shall have a comfortable support during her life, if it consumes the whole of my property both capital and income to give it to her.

Item 7th I appoint and appoint my beloved wife Mary S. Youngblood as the sole executrix of this my will and release her from any obligation or liability to make any returns of her acts and doings to any Court whatever.

Witness my hand and seal this July 26th 1868.
