Friday April 3rd 1859.

In the name of God Amen
I Samuel Howard of the County of Washington and State
of Georgia "a planter" willing to make the will of my
body, being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory
do Ordain this my last will and testament viz to bring these
my things wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this
life, I dispose of the same in the following manner and form
to wit 1st I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy
Howard the following negroes namely, Martin a fellow
or man Easter an old woman and Selina a young man
and to sell and dispose of as she sees proper, also a fine
gray mare and sorrel horse Colt two years old, and ten
head of Cattle to dispose of in the same manner, And
also land to my wife Nancy for and during her natural
life the following property to wit, The House, and land
wherein I now live together with all the Household and
Kitchen furniture and plantation tools &c

2nd I lend to Harriet Broughton formerly Harriet Sevin
who I claim as my beloved daughter, the following prop-
erty namely five negroes to wit Anna and her husband
Jerry, Ahancy, Aaron & Jacob, for and during her natural
life and at her decease to be equally divided between
the lawful heirs of her body to wit and dispose of as they
shall think proper forever

3rd I lend to my beloved daughter Malinda Brooks
formerly Malinda Howard, the following property, five
negroes, namely Eliza Phipps, Dick, John Fells, and Phoebe
to be equally divided between the lawful heirs of her
body to sell and dispose of as they may think proper
forever

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4th It is my will and desire that the aforesaid lots of meadows lent to the aforesaid Harriett and Matilda should be valued and appraised by three freeholders sworn for that purpose and the aforesaid named lots to the aforesaid Harriett be made equal in valuation to the aforesaid named lot to the aforesaid Matilda out of the rest of my property not herebefore or hereafter otherwise disposed of

5th It is my will that all my bonds notes accounts rents issues and remainders of every kind & description be collected and out of the same paying therefrom all my just debts to be settled and paid off and the balance left after all my debts are settled and paid off to be equally divided between my wife Nancy and the aforesaid Harriett and Matilda to sell and dispose of as they shall think proper forever

6th It is my will and desire that my wife Nancy should have a sufficiency of my Stock of Hogs to answer her plantation use for one year, and also a sufficiency of Corn and fodder and provision of every kind for to serve her for one year as may be agreed on by her and my Executor, or by men appointed by her and my Executor to arbitrate the same, to sell and dispose of as they think proper forever

7th And it is my will that the remainder of my Hogs the remainder of my Stock of Cattle Hogs, and all other parts and parcels remainders and remainders of property belonging to my Estate to be equally divided between the aforesaid Harriett Roughton and Matilda Brooks to sell and dispose of as they shall think proper forever

8th And after the decease of my wife Nancy it is my will and desire that the land and other property which I had lent her should be equally divided between the surviving and lawfull heirs of the bodies of the aforesaid Harriett Roughton and Matilda Brooks to sell and dispose of as they shall see proper forever

Lastly I do ordain and appoint William P. Howarth and John Long my Executors and I do satisfy and confirm this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal in the presence of the subscribing witnesses and they subscribe in the presence of each other the day and date above written
