Washington County, In the name of God Amen.

I Lewis Bullard of the County and State aforesaid being weak in body, but strong and disposing mind and memory, desiring to arrange all of my worldly matters while I have time and opportunity to do so, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

First it is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, and that my soul will return to rest with my Heavenly Father who gave it.

Second. As touching my worldly goods, with which it hath pleased God to give me. It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Elmera Bullard keep together all of my estate both real and personal during her natural life with the following proviso, viz, that she pay over to each one of my children as they shall arrive to the age of twenty one years Fifteen Hundred Dollars. My son John Bullard having received that amount, At my wifes death the whole of my estate then remaining, to be sold and be equally divided between all of my children then living and the legal representatives of those that may be dead according to law. Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elmera Executive and my Son John Bullard Executor, to this my last Will & Testament.

Item second In the event that said land should be sold at public sale or at private sale for me by the Administrator of my daughter Sarah Cook then I wish the proceeds of said land paid over to said Nancy Blizard after my death if any should be left, after my death I nominate Committee and appoint my friend Berry Peeler, my Executor to this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand this 5th day of May 1866. Signed by the testator in the presence of Lydia Cook James D. Robinson and by us in presence of each other
