First. I give my Doctor with his wife, one thousand dollars of money and attention to my poor yellow eyes, a reasonable amount, and I desire the graves of myself and my first husband to be made and substantially enclosed and head and side tablets of marble or something durable to be placed at each grave.

Second. I give and bequeath to my two sisters Mrs. Lizzie A. Shoreland and Mrs. Nancy J. Hayes wife of Clark County Kentucky, all of me wearing apparel and bed clothing, with a request that they give a portion of them to my sister Mrs. Elizabeth A. Rangier of the City of Atlanta.

Third. I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs. Jane A. Shoreland of Clark County Kentucky Fifty Dollars.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs. Nancy J. Hayes of Clark County, Kentucky Fifty Dollars.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my two brothers Orion C. Robison & Calvin C. Robison both Clark County Kentucky One hundred Dollars each.

Sixth. I give and bequeath to Mr. Emily S. Miller of Washington County Ga One hundred Dollars.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my nephews William S. Robison and John S. Robison both of Peachbridge Fulton County Georgia One hundred Dollars each.

Eighth. I give and bequeath to Mr. Condit Palmer of Washington County Ga all my household and kitchen furniture, except that mentioned in Article second.

Ninth. I give and bequeath to F. S. Sawyer my family Bible.

Tenth. I hereby appoint Martha Robison and Israel B. Sawyer Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
