Robison of the County of Washington and State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs, while I have strength to do so, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me at any time heretofore made.

and first I commit my soul to the God who gave it, and my body I desire to be buried in a decent Christian-like manner in the family burial ground of my place and my worldly goods I dispose of as follows.

First. I give and bequeath to my dear and dear friends of nursing and attention in my last sickness, a reasonable amount, and I desire the graves of myself, late my first husband, to be neatly and substantially enclosed and head and feet instead of marble or something durable to be placed at each grave.

Second. I give and bequeath to my two sisters Mrs. Sallie A. Moreland and Mrs. Nancy S. Hughes both of Blount County Kentucky, all of my wearing apparel and bed clothing, with a request that they give a portion of them to my sister Mrs. Elizabeth C. Rogers of the State of Virginia.

Third. I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs. Sallie A. Moreland of Blount County Kentucky Fifty Dollars.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs. Nancy S. Hughes of Blount County, Kentucky Fifty Dollars.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my two brothers Orran C. Robison & Calvin C. Robison both Blount County Kentucky, One hundred Dollars each.

Sixth. I give and bequeath to Mr. Emily C. Miller of Washington County Ga One hundred Dollars.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my nephews William J. Robison and John S. Robison both of Bainbridge Tatuloo County Georgia One hundred Dollars each.

Eighth. I give and bequeath to the Court Clerk of Washington County Ga all my household and kitchen furniture, except that mentioned in Article second.

Ninth. I give and bequeath to J. S. Joyner my family Bible.

Tenth. I hereby appoint Martha Newman and Abel P. Joyner Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
