and knowing that I must shortly depart this world, deem it right and
proper both as respects myself and family that I should make a dispo-
sition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I there-
fore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling
all others heretofore made by me.

Item first I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition.
My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, As I hope
for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ
whose religion I have professed, and I humbly trust have enjoyed
for forty years.

Item Second - I desire and direct that all my just debt, be
paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named.

Item third - I give and devise to my daughter Penelope
Cone wife of Archibald Cone one hundred and thirty Dollars.

Item fourth I give and devise to my three grand children Mary
Cason wife of John F. Cason Jonathan H. Baker, and Mary Baker
the children of Blake H. Baker, each twenty Dollars.

Item fifth - I desire and request that my bed, bed clothing
and cloaths should remain in and belong to the family with which
I may be living at the time of my decease.

Item Sixth - The rest of my property both real and personal whomever
and whatever it may be I desire and bequeath to my son Joseph
Harrison, my daughter Phoebe M. Kinnon wife of John M. Kinnon,
my daughter Sarah West widow of James West deceased, and
my son Jonathan Baker to be equally divided between them share
and share alike.

Item Seventh - I constitute and appoint my son Jonathan Baker
Executor to this my last Will and Testament this 3rd day of April 1852.

In the name of God Amen - I William P. Waynes of the County of Washington and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, while I have strength to do so, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made

Item 1st It is my Will and desire that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter named with as little delay as possible

Item It is my Will and desire that all the property both real and personal of which I am possessed shall be and I hereby give the same absolutely to my beloved wife Moriah P. Waynes for her use and disposal to be disposed of by her in her judgement shall dictate, except as hereafter excepted

Item 3rd It is my Will and desire that my Son Wm and my daughter Moriah be educated out of the proceeds of my Estate just so long as in the judgement of my said Executors this course shall be deemed prudent and proper, I desire however if the means above suggested will be adequate, that they both receive as liberal education as my beloved son Drafton and my beloved daughter Frances have received at my hands

Item 4th It is my Will and desire that my Executors hereafter to be named, be at full liberty to sell any property of my said Estate which in their judgement is not necessary to be retained for the use of my said wife and for the purpose aforesaid, and that this power they exercise without being compelled to obtain an order from the Ordinary for that purpose

Item 5th It is my Will and desire and I hereby appoint my beloved wife Moriah P. Waynes and my Brother in law, Andrew J. Lane to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament

In Witness whereof the said William P. Waynes, have to this my Will consisting of a page and a half of foolscap paper set my hand and Seal this 3rd day of January 1856
