Item second:- After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give bequeath and devise to my beloved sister Theodora Brown all my estate, both real and personal, of which I shall die seized and possessed, subject to the terms, conditions and limitations herein in the next item set forth and expressed.

Item third:- In the event, that my beloved sister said Theodora W. Brown shall happen to die without any child or children or representative of child or children, living at the time of her death, then I give bequeath and devise to my friends H. R. Newcome and Edwin L. Adams their heirs executors administrators and assigns, all my estate both real and personal in the foregoing item given bequeathed and devised to my sister, said Theodora W. Brown.

Item fourth:- I hereby constitute and appoint my said friends H. R. Newcome and Edwin L. Adams, Executors of this, my last Will and Testament.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give devise and bequeath to my nephew Stephen A. Hitchcock the other half of my entire property and estate.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint Sharon Warthen Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
