Item Fourth When my youngest comes of age I want my Estate to be equally divided between my beloved Wife and Children.

Item Fifth I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Martha Executrix and my two Sons Charles and George W. Moige and Miss G. Wood Executors to this my Will and to commence this October 30<sup>th</sup> 1857.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my Grand Son Eugene M' Murray son of John M' Murray, the sum of thirty five hundred Dollars, six hundred and eighty five dollars and fifty one cents of which he has already received, to be paid out of the effects of my Estate, and should it be necessary for me to advance him any more, it also is to be deducted from the aforesaid thirty five hundred dollars.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> The remainder of my Estate I bequeath to the children of my Brother Remond Moots, of the County of Cummington to be equally divided between them or their legal heirs.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint George Whiddon my Executor to carry out this my last Will and Testament.

Item 7<sup>th</sup> In case my Grand Son Eugene M' Murray should die without issue I desire that his portion of my Estate go to the Children of my Brother Sam = some allots or their legal heirs.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved son Zachariah G Sheppard the Horse of the same value of those mentioned in the preceding item and one Son and pigs

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Ann C Sheppard one Cow, one Calf and Son and pigs

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I give and divide to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my land, namely the lot in which I now live consisting of 200 acres, also one hundred acres known by the name of the Harris lot, and also the half
