Item 5th The remainder of my Estate I bequeath to the children of my Brother Rasmus Moors of the County of Cumberland to be equally divided between them or their legal heirs

Item 6th I hereby constitute and appoint Isaac Whiddon my Executor to carry out this my last Will and Testament

Item 7 In case my Grand Son Eugene M. Murry should die without issue then I desire that his portion of my Estate go to the children of my Brother Rasmus Moors or their legal heirs

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my beloved son Jacobus J. Sheppard one Horse of the same value of those mentioned in the foregoing items and one Sore and pigs

Item 5 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Ann S. Sheppard one Small Calf and Sore and pigs

Item 6 I give and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth, all my lands, namely the lot in which I now live consisting of 200 acres also one hundred acres known by the name of the Harris lot, and also the half
