I Zacheriah Brantley, of the State and County aforesaid being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory do hereby and proper, that I should make a disposition of the property of which a kind Providence has blessed me do make and Or claim this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

First I desire and direct that my Executors hereinafter named sell such of my property as they think advisable for the purpose of paying off and discharging all my just debts.

Secondly. I leave to my beloved wife Mary Brantley for and during her natural life, all the property of whatever kind or distribution I may possess; after my just debts have been paid, and at her death my will and desire is that said property be equally divided, one moiety of which is to vest in Solomon D Brantley in trust for Mary C Brantley wife of said Solomon D and her children, the other moiety to vest in William S Brantley in trust for his wife Mary M Brantley and her children.

Thirdly. It is my will and desire that at any time during the existence of the life estate herein created it become necessary to sell or change any portion of the property, that my Executors hereinafter named shall have power to do so by and with the consent of my beloved wife Mary.

Fourthly. I constitute and appoint my two sons Solomon D Brantley and William S Brantley Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the thirtieth day of June 1860.
