I Mitchell Watkins of said County and State hereby make
ordain and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling
all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1. To my beloved wife Sarah, I bequeath all my lands in Washington County
of this State, except One hundred and Twenty Acres more or less, which I
have previously deeded to my beloved son Le Fayette Washington excepting also five
acres, I now bequeath to my son Le Fayette bearing and share as well place his
dwelling entirely upon his land and not giving all share to either tract namely to
the bequest to my wife Sarah nor to the deed I have given to said son Le Fayette
said deed not having yet been recorded and being dated Twenty fourth of October
1879.

Item 2. I further will that my beloved wife Sarah use and enjoy the land here
bequeathed during her life with all the stock of horses, cattle, hogs
plantation and growing utensils and continue the business of the farm without
sale of her own property at public sale settling all just debts.

Item 3. After the death of my beloved wife Sarah, I desire the lands here
bequeathed to my beloved wife Sarah to be divided between my beloved
son Charon Wiley and Le Fayette Washington in such manner as will be most con-
venient and equitable.

Item 4. To my son William E. I bequeath one (\$1) Dollar. To my great grand
son Robert Mills I also bequeath one dollar likewise to my great grand
son Bradford Cooper I herein bequeath one dollar.

Item 5. To my grandsons Horace Mills I bequeath one hundred Dollars and
likewise to the heirs of my beloved daughter Lucy Conville collectively
I bequeath one hundred Dollars.

Item 6. The bequest designated in Item 5th namely to Horace Mills and to the
heirs of my daughter Lucy Conville I desire to be paid from money
from my tobacco lots of about one hundred and fifty acres and also to pay in satisfaction
some thing two lots of One hundred and thirty acres and forty acres aggregating
two hundred acres - The one half of One hundred acres I give to my son
William E. by contract to collect - The hundred Dollars of balance appropriated
as bequeathed in Item 5th and should not enough make him out of said
lands to satisfy the said bequest in Item 5th the amount should be supplemented
from money from my estate in Washington County.

Item 7. After sale of the Two Hundred Acres lots should there be a sum of money
in excess of the Two hundred dollars for the bequest of Item 5th
I desire balance to be divided equally with my wife Sarah and my son Ray, John
W. and Charon W.
