I Moses Robison of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this deem it right and proper both respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other heretofore made by me

1<sup>st</sup> Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul shall return to rest with God who gave it

2<sup>d</sup> Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed, as I am unwilling my Creditors should be delayed in their rights

3<sup>rd</sup> Item I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my tract or parcel of land in the County of Washington, wherein I now reside containing six hundred and seventy five acres more or less with all the appurtenances thereto during her natural life, after which I desire the said land to be divided among my three sons Robert Robison W<sup>m</sup>t Robison and Rufus A Robison

4<sup>th</sup> Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife a negro boy about about twenty five years old and a negro girl Harriett about eight years old, my riding carriage and two of my horses such ones as she may choose out of my lot of Horses, three Cows and Calves, three sows and pigs and ten head of sheep, all the Household and Kitchen furniture, three hundred bushels of Corn one thousand pounds of pork, three thousand pounds of fodder three plow gears, three weeding hoes, two club axes, to her own proper use benefit and behoof of herself, with full power to dispose of the same, at any time previous, or by will or deed at her death in she may think proper

5<sup>th</sup> Item I give and bequeath to my son Rufus A Robison a negro boy and a negro girl Jelious Caesar & Sophronia about thirteen year old to him forever

6<sup>th</sup> Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Penelope Robison a negro woman Elmy about thirty years old and her two daughters Mary about six year old and Indiana about two year old youse, and I appoint my son William A Robison trustee of the property herein given and bequeathed to my daughter Penelope Francis Robison and all her heirs

7<sup>th</sup> Item I give to my daughter Martha Robison two hundred dollars to be raised out of my effects

8<sup>th</sup> Item I give to my daughter Olga Ann Wamble two hundred and twenty five dollars to be raised out of my effects

9<sup>th</sup> Item The remainder of my property both real and personal whatever it may be I desire to be disposed of and equally distributed among all of my legal heirs

10<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint my sons Robert Robison, William A Robison and Rufus A Robison Executors of this my last will and testament.

In the name of God, amen I John Covington of Washington County  
and State of Georgia being of sound and perfect mind and memory before  
the God do this the twenty first day of September in the year of our Lord  
Eighteen hundred and twenty four make and publish this my last Will  
and Testament in manner following that is to say First I bind to my  
beloved Wife Alice Covington during her natural life the plantation  
which I now live, containing two hundred in all, there being three hundred  
and forty acres with the improvements thereon also her negro fellows  
Isaac and Silas and a negro Woman named Betty and all the Household  
and Kitchens Furniture five Cows and Calves twelve head of Sheep, two  
Horses such as she may choose, also my riding gig, and as many Plantation  
utentials as she may think necessary for the farm, which property at the  
decease of my wife, I do hereby give unto the Child or Children which as they  
have, if any ~~have~~ ~~if any~~ we have, until they receive an equal prop  
erty with the rest of the other Children which are hereafter mentioned the  
remainder if there be any to be equally divided among all my children

Item I give to my daughter Mary and Charles Tidico, her husband  
the property before given unto their possession by two hundred acres of  
land on which they now live on, one negro girl named Olive three Cows  
and Calves one Son and Piggs, one feather bed and furniture one years  
provision, some Corn and meat which they have had

Item I give to my daughter Charlotte and her husband John  
Webb the property before given unto their possession by two hundred acres  
of land, one negro girl named Ruth one feather bed, one cow  
and Piggs one feather bed and furniture and one years provision  
some Corn and meat which they have had

Item I give to my daughter Marritt and her husband John Tidico
