

Moses Robison will,

I Moses Robison of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it

2^d Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed, as I am unwilling my Creditors should be delayed in their rights.

3^d Item I give bequeath and devise to my beloved Wife Elizabeth all my tract or parcel of land in the County of Washington, between I now reside containing six hundred and seventy five acres more or less with all the appertinances thence due during her natural life, after which I desire the said land to be divided among my three sons, Robert Robison W^m & Robison and Rufus A Robison

4th Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife a negro boy John about about twenty five years old and a negro girl Harriette about eight years old, my riding Carriage and two of my Horses, such ones as she may choose out of my lot of Horses, three Cows and Calves, three sows and pigs and ten heads of sheep, all the Household and Kitchen furniture, three hundred bushels of Corn one thousand pounds of pork, three thousand pounds of fodder three plows, gears, three weeding hoes, two club axes, to her and proper use benefit and behoof, forever, with full power to dispose of the same, at any time previous, or by Will or deed at her death, as she may think proper

5th Item, I give and bequeath to my son Rufus A Robison a negro boy and a negro girl Julius Caesar & Josephine about thirteen years old to him forever

6th Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Penelope Frances Robison a negro woman Genny about thirty years old and her two daughters Mary about six years old and Indiana about two years old forever, and I appoint my Son William A Robison trustee of the property herein given and bequeathed to my Daughter Penelope Frances Robison and all her heirs

7th Item I give to my Daughter Martha Robison two hundred Dollars to be raised out of my effects.

8th Item I give to my Daughter Eliza Ann Humble two hundred and twenty five Dollars to be raised out of my effects

9th Item The remainder of my property both real and personal whatever it may be I desire to be disposed of and equally distributed among all of my legal heirs

10 I hereby certify that the foregoing is the true and correct last will and testament of Moses Robison, Executors of his my last Will and testament

The last Will and testament of Moses Robison was proven and recorded at September Term of the Court of Ordinary for Washington County 1851 which Original and Copy record of said Will was destroyed by fire in Sandusville on the 24 day of March 1853, a Copy of which was established and recorded at November term 1857 from a copy attached to the latter testamentary granted to the Executors.

In the name of God Amen I John Covington of Washington County and State of Georgia being of sound and perfect mind and memory bless the God do this the twenty first day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty four make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner following that is to say, First I bequeath to my beloved Wife Oloca Covington during her natural life, the plantation which I now live, containing two tracts in all, there being three hundred and forty acres with the improvements thereon, also her negro fellows Isaac and Silas and a Negro woman named Polly and all the household and kitchen furniture five cows and calves, twelve head of sheep, two horses such as she may choose, also my riding giggs, and as many plantation utensils as she may think necessary for the farm, which property at the decease of my wife, I do hereby give unto the child or children which we may have, if any ~~children~~ if any we have, until they receive an equal proportion with the rest of the other children which are hereafter mentioned the remainder if there be any to be equally divided among all my children.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary and Charles Fisher, her husband the property before given unto their possession by two hundred acres of land on which they now live on, one negro girl named Olive three cows and calves one son and wigg, one feather bed and furniture one year provision, some corn and meat which they have had.

Item I give to my Daughter Charlotte and her husband John Webb the property before given unto their possession by two hundred & three ~~in all~~ one ~~negro~~ named ~~Rebecca~~ ~~one son and wigg~~, one son and wigg one feather bed and furniture and one year provision some corn and meat which they have had.
