I, Mrs. Adrian R. Jones, the widow and relict of Adair R. Jones late of Washington County Georgia deceased, do hereby make declare and publish this act for my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills and wills made by me and hereby disclaiming of all the property, rights of property of which I may die seized and possessed, in whatever the same may consist and wherever the same may be situated.

1st. I wish my body to have the rites of Christian burial according to my condition in life, and any debts I may leave to be paid as soon after my death as may be.

2d. The remainder of the Trust property I received from my mother,

the same being the proceeds of a house and two lots in Sandaville, which I sold, or nearly did, in my husband's name, I wish to be divided into two parts, one half of the same to be paid to my grandson, George R. Jones, the other half of the same to be equally divided among the seven children of my deceased son, Stephen Benjamin Jones; in case any of said children should die before me, leaving child or children, the share of the grandchild so dying to go to his or her children share and share alike.

3d. All the remainder of my estate and property of every kind I wish divided into eight equal parts, one share of which I give to my grandchild, George R. Jones, the other seven parts or halves I give to the seven children of my deceased son, Stephen Benjamin Jones, one share to each of his children.

4th. I appoint no Executor in this my Will, but may do so in a codicil.
