

Haney Francis Will.

Washington County In the name of "God Amen"

I Haney Francis of the County and State aforesaid within
being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart from
this world, doon it right and proper, both as respects myself and
family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a
kind Providence has blessed me, — Therefore make this my last
Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore
made by me.

Item 1^o I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and Conve-
nience — My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave
it — as I hope you eternal salvation through the blessed Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed, as
as I humbly trust enjoyed for Ninety years.

Item 2^o I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without
delay by my Executor hereafter to be named and appointed as I
am unwilling that my creditors should be delayed in the attainment
of their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay.

Item 3^o I give and devise to Haney St. Mull formerly Haney's
Benson a negro woman named Mary about thirty years now old
with a son of hers about eighteen years old — Given a son of hers
fifteen years old — Hindman a son of Mary Benson, now old and a
young girl named Wesley about eighteen years old which said names &
negro I give to the said Haney St. Mull for and during her life time
then to be equally divided between her children share and share alike.

Item 4^o I give and devise to Jane R. Mull formerly Jane Stephens a
negro boy named John about fourteen years old also one Steel Bedst.
and furniture for the same.

Item 5^o I desire and direct that my stock of horses cattle Hogs
Sheep Oxen and Cart Riding Carriage and wagons & its bedsteads
and all my Household and Kitchen property except so much as is
above disposed of together with the balance of my property in
every description, to be sold and the money equally divided between
Ann A. Mull formerly Ann A. Stephens — Augustus Benson
and Henry Jackson Benson.

Item 6^o I desire that my Esq. wife carry the account due me from
my Husband Estate in the hands of his Executors and that he equitably
divide the same between Ann A. Mull formerly Ann A. Stephens
Augustus Benson and Henry Jackson Benson.

Item 7^o I desire and direct that all money or monies together with
all notes due me at my decease be collected by my Executor so
that the sum be equally divided between Ann A. Mull formerly
Ann A. Stephens Augustus Benson and Henry Jackson Benson.

Item 8^o It is my desire that whatever property may be found
coming to Ann A. Mull above named under this my last
Will and Testament be secured to her in trust during her lifetime

and after her death to be disposed of as she may think proper before her death
I desire it to be entirely free from the control of her present Husband or any
future Husband whom she may have... And I therefore appoint my Nephew
John W. Ridgway as her Trustee in this behalf and request him to accept
the trust.

Item 9 - I give and devise to Nancy H. Smith formerly Nancy H. Dunn
one set of Silver Tea Spoons, also one pair Sugar tongs.

Item 10 I nominate and appoint my worthy friend Samuel Harris
Executor of this my last Will and Testament this day signed declare
and publish here by me in the presence of the subscriber witness hereto the
thirty third day of July in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and fifty one

Georgia Know all men by these presents that I Agnes
Washington County Robertson of the County and State aforesaid being
low in health yet of sound mind. And well know-
ing that it is appointed to all once to die to do ordain and establish
this my last Will and Testament

I will and bequeath to my only daughter Drupmy P Hodges
every thing I possess on said plantation and land
on which my son in law Reddick Hodges now resides, and the
following named Negroes to wit Nedee and no five Children to
wit Nathan Farmer, Caroline, Jack and Romeo together with
their future increase. Also two Horses, three head of Stock Cattle
and twenty head of Stock Hogs with their future increase to be
kept by her the said Drupmy P Hodges for and during her nat-
ural life, and to be used for the service of the said Drupmy P and
the negroes now or her body during her natural life, and at her the
said Drupmy P Hodges shall the whole of the above described prop-
erty bequeath with its increase to an equally divided amongst the lawful
heirs of the body of her the said Drupmy P Hodges, forever in fee simple.
