And from the proceeds of such sales, I desire that she pay my just debts (if any exist) as soon as practicable, and the residue be applied by her for her maintenance and the maintenance and education of my children.
- III. I hereby appoint my beloved wife Amelia E. Witt, guardian of the person and property of our children and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament.
